If there are urgent matters in the family that require your child's absence from school, please inform the school and/or Form Teachers in writing. Your request will be subjected to the school's consideration and approval. When your child's/ward's leave application is approved, students should be prepared to put in more effort to catch up on their assignments. 3 Safety and Security Reminders

3.1 Entry into School and Dismissal Matters

- 3.1.1. Please note that except for medication and spectacles, the school will not accept any other items to be delivered to our students. We seek parents' cooperation in encouraging our students to be responsible for their belongings.
- 3.1. 2 In the interest of the safety and security of our students, parents or visitors are not allowed to enter into the school except for urgent or official matters. All visitors must first report to the Security Guard Post at Gate 2 to obtain a 'Visitor Pass' before proceeding to the General Office. Please provide a valid identity document (e.g. identity card, work permit) for verification and registration at the Security Guard Post to exchange for a visitor pass.
- 3.1. 3 To ensure orderly dismissal, we appeal to parents/guardians/caregivers not to obstruct student movement and to practise social distancing when waiting outside the school gates. With the installation of turnstile at all gates of EPPS, parent/guardian/caregiver will no longer be allowed to wait in the school from Term 3 onwards. They have to stand outside the turnstile during arrival or dismissal time.
- 3.1.4 Please train your child/ward to look out for the right person to accompany him/her home and not to follow strangers or their friends. Remind your child/ward that they should go to the General Office for assistance should they be unable to find his/her caregiver during dismissal.
- 3.1.5 We would like to appeal to all parents/guardians who drive their child/ward to school to use the designated covered drop-off/pick-up points located near Blocks 517 and 504, Pasir Ris Street 52, during peak traffic periods. This will ease the traffic congestion at Gate 1, main entrance to school carpark. Parents and guardians are also reminded not to park along the road outside the school during dismissal time as their vehicles block the view of other drivers and pedestrians, causing safety concerns.

3.2 Emergency Evacuation Drill

To ensure emergency preparedness, the school will be conducting an evacuation exercise in July / August 2025 where staff and students will leave the school in big groups, walking to our external holding area in Pasir Ris Elias Community Centre. A PG message will be sent to the parents nearer to the exercise date.

3.3 Birthday Gifts

We seek parents' assistance not to send birthday gifts to their children to school or distribute birthday gifts or goodie bags to their children's classmates in school as such practices may unintentionally create feelings of exclusion or comparison among students. Your understanding and cooperation will help us maintain a warm, respectful and inclusive environment for all our students.

3.4 Smart Watches, Mobile Phones and Other Electronic Devices

Our Student Planner contains important information for all Eliasians. Please spend some time to go through the safety information in the School Planner with your child/ward and reinforce the key points with them. We would like to highlight the following information found on page 12:

Students are strongly discouraged from bringing mobile phones or other electronic devices to school. Students who bring mobile phones to school are only allowed to use them in the school canteen after dismissal, to make calls for emergency purposes or valid reasons.

Students caught using mobile phones or other electronic devices during lessons or without valid reasons will have them confiscated by any teacher and can only be retrieved personally by their parents. The school will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to the students' mobile phones or electronic devices.

4 Grow Well SG: A Holistic Approach to Our Children's Health

Grow Well SG is a multi-ministry strategy led by the Ministry of Health (MOH), Ministry of Education (MOE) and the Ministry of Social & Family Development (MSF) to give children a good start in life, teaching them healthy habits from a young age.

Habits that children learn when they are young can stick with them for life, shaping their health and well-being as they grow. Hence, it is important to start good habits early in four key areas: screen use, physical activity, nutrition, and sleep.

Each year, as part of the annual health screening in schools, experienced doctors and nurses will create a customised Health Plan for your child. The Health Plan includes health screening results, lifestyle prescription and referral letters (if applicable).

Parents play a pivotal role in guiding your child towards making positive lifestyle choices. With this plan, co-developed with your child, parents will have the tools to guide your child in making positive, impactful lifestyle choices. B SCHOOL PROGRAMMES IN TERM 3

1 Racial Harmony Day Celebrations

Every year, EPPS commemorates Racial Harmony Day (RHD) as a reminder to our students and staff on how we can play a part to build a cohesive society. A series of activities have been

planned for our students from Monday 21 July to Friday 25 July 2025 to gain deeper understanding on the importance of harmony and social cohesion. 2 National Day Celebrations

This year marks Singapore's 60th year of independence. The SG60 theme, *Building Our Singapore Together*, aims to celebrate our nation-building journey and reflect on our shared values of multiculturalism, boldness, resilience and openness that have united us and allowed us to prosper against the odds over the past 60 years.

The National Day celebrations in school will take place on Friday, 8 August from 7.30 a.m. to 10.30 a.m. All Eliasians will report to school as usual and we will begin our morning assembly and observance ceremony at 7.25 a.m. Please note that the dress code is a red/PE t-shirt, with PE shorts and school shoes. 3 Interdisciplinary Project Work (IPW)

Our IPW programme develops students who will grow to become citizen leaders with empathy and resilience, as they work together to solve the issues, supporting our nuCLEAR@EPPS.

The Primary 4 and 5 students will embark on their IPW over a period of one week in their English, Mathematics and Science lessons. Working in groups, students will collaborate to explore issues presented to them. Through these projects, our students will learn the process of Design Thinking. Primary 4 students will learn about the impact of littering on the environment and the importance of being self-sufficient. More crucially, students will recognise the part they can play and how their actions can help to protect our environment. Our Primary 5 students will be doing their IPW in Term 3 from 1 July to 8 July.
