#### Do

- Explore the many education pathways available that best meet your needs, strengths and interests.
- Besides your family members, you can also have conversations with other trusted adults who know you well to advise and guide you (e.g. teacher, school counsellor).
- Decide and act based on the options that you have.






#### **Exploring Your Options: SchoolFinder**



# Understanding the Secondary School Experience under Full Subject-Based Banding (FSBB)


With FSBB, you can learn each subject at the level that suits you best and be in classes with friends who have different strengths, interests and abilities.

#### **ELIGIBILITY FOR HMTL IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS**

 To take HMTL in secondary schools, students should meet the following criteria:

#### **ELIGIBLITY CRITERIA FOR HMTL**

PSLE MTL score of AL1/AL2

or

HMTL score of Distinction/Merit

 Schools also have the flexibility to allow students who do not meet the above criteria to take HMTL, if they are assessed to have exceptional ability in MTL and are able to take HMTL without affecting their performance in other subjects.

## Submitting school choices after receiving PSLE results



The previous year's PSLE score range via SchoolFinder or MySkillsFuture Student Portal should only be used as a guide.



Use all 6 options with different cut-off points (COPs).




In choosing secondary schools, it is not about getting into the most popular school but the school that can develop your strengths, interests and abilities.

You are strongly encouraged to include at least 2 to 3 schools where your PSLE score is better than the school's previous year's COP.

- COPs of schools can fluctuate by a few points year-onyear.
- Meeting the COP of a school does not guarantee admission.
- Rank your preferred school higher in the choice order of schools, to increase your chances of being posted to that school, especially in tie-breaking situation.

#### Understanding the PSLE Score Ranges

Use the PSLE score ranges as a guide to explore school choices via **SchoolFinder** 



PSLE score of the <u>first</u> student posted to the school through the respective Posting Groups.

PSLE score of the <u>last</u> student posted to the school through the respective Posting Groups-i.e. the school's **cut-off point (COP)** 

- The PSLE score range shows the PSLE score of the first and last student admitted to a school in the previous year through S1 Posting.
- For each school, the cut-off point (COP) is determined by the PSLE score of the last student posted to that school in each Posting Group.
- More importantly, consider schools that will fit your strengths, interests, abilities, talents and learning needs, and are not too far for you to travel daily.





## Selection of Secondary Schools

#### S1 Option – Through Internet System

- Can be completed through the Secondary One Internet System (S1-IS) in MOE's S1
  Posting website
- The S1-IS is accessible 24 hours a day within the online submission period of

11.30 am, 25 Nov 2025 to 4.30pm, 1 Dec 2025



### Selection of Secondary Schools

#### S1 Option – In Person at School

Option form can also be submitted at EPPS General Office at the following timing

11.30am from <u>25 Nov 2025 to 4.30pm 1 Dec 2025</u>

(except weekends)

### Sec 1 Posting

#### **Posting Results**

- Will be released on either Thursday, 18 December 2025 or Friday, 19 December 2025
- S1 posting results can be accessed through:
- SMS via a local mobile number (if provided during the application/option process)
- 2. S1 Portal (Using parents' Singpass)
- **3. EPPS** from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm



### Sec 1 Posting

#### **Reporting to Sec School**

- Each school has specific instructions for new students.
- Visit the Secondary School's website for more information (e.g reporting details, booklist, and purchase of books and uniforms) on how to prepare your child for the new school term.



### Appeal for Review of Results

- Parents may appeal for a review of the results for the marking of the scripts to be rechecked.
- All appeal for review of results <u>must be</u> made through the Principal.
- An appeal fee will be charged for each subject and appeal application must reach SEAB by 1 December 2025.
- Parents must pay online and present the payment confirmation to the school when submitting their appeal form.
